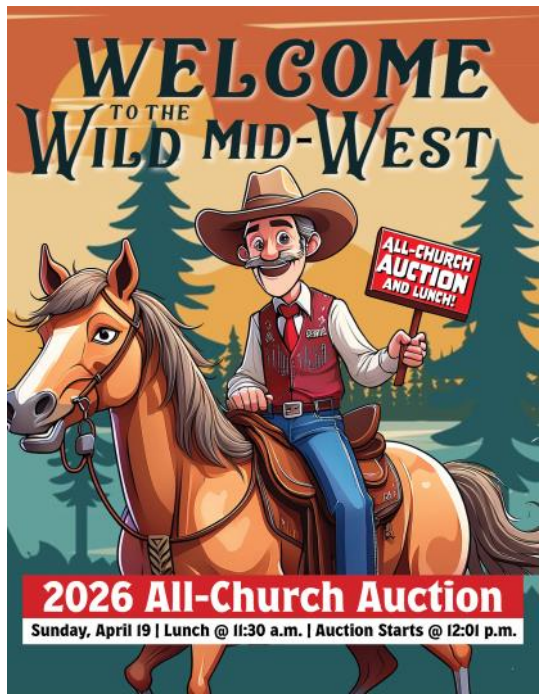

### What is the Service Auction?

**Bone Health is an important topic for men and women of all ages !** This series of classes will give attendees new or confirmed knowledge on how bones grow, how what we eat can help or harm bone cells, and how bones respond to the purposeful stress of exercise. Each of the four sessions is a separate topic, people are welcome to attend one or all four. There is no cost. People who attend 2 or more sessions will be entered into a drawing for a 60 minute individualized assessment of strength, mobility, flexibility, and balance.
